EIF equity activity in Belgium

General remarks

Since 2005, EIF has committed to nine Belgium-based funds at different stages of the investment spectrum, including University technology transfer, seed capital, early-stage venture capital and midmarket private equity funds.

In terms of industry sector, these funds are active in the ICT, Life Sciences, Cleantech/Eco-innovation sectors, as well as generalist funds investing in more traditional industries.

In addition to these Belgian teams, EIF has also committed to a number of teams based in the Netherlands with a multi-country investment focus that includes Belgium and the Flanders region (e.g. Bencis Capital Partners, GEM Benelux, Gilde Healthcare, Life Science Partners, Waterland Private Equity).

EIF guarantee activity in Belgium

General remarks

EIF's guarantee activity mainly comes in the form of providing credit enhancement in the context of securitisations of SME loans, using EIF own resources, and of capped portfolio guarantees for new SME financing under the EU Competitiveness and Innovation Programme ("CIP") using European Union budgetary resources.

EIF has participated in three SME securitisations with ING Bank and with Fortis Bank (now BNP Paribas Fortis), and has signed CIP agreements with two Belgian counterparties, the commercial bank Belfius and the promotional lender Fonds de Participation.

A split by region is available for the EU CIP agreements: as of 30/06/2012, more than 3,300 companies received guaranteed loans. 42% of the companies are located in Flanders, 44% in Wallonia, and 14% in the Brussels Region.

EIF operates as manager of third party mandates supported by the European Commission and/or the European Investment Bank (Progress Microfinance, EPPA, Micro RCM).
